Description of the program	The main goal of the program is for the participant (prisoner) to acquire basic knowledge of the English language, whereby he will be able to understand and actively use spoken and written English at level A1.1 according to the Common European Framework of Languages. With the help of the acquired knowledge of the English language, the participants in the program can more easily reintegrate and rehabilitate, which will make them more competitive in the labor market, which will also reduce the number of returnees after serving the sentence. The way of realizing the program is through practical and theoretical training to enable the participants to acquire basic knowledge of the English language so that they can understand simple speech and text, be able to ask simple questions and answer them, be able to describe objects, people, talk about everyday experiences, as well as be able to write short sentences and short simple text. The duration of the program is 72 hours which are a combination of theoretical part.

Objectives of the program	The participant: Can understand when the interlocutor speaks slowly, with a clear pronunciation; Can understand simple instructions on how to get from point A to point B, on foot or by public transport; Can understand numbers, prices and time expressions; Can understand basic information about people in newspapers (their place of residence, age, etc.); Can understand the text of a form (hotel application); Can understand words and phrases of the signs that he encounters in his daily life (e.g. no smoking, parking, no parking, etc.) Can understand the most important commands on a computer such as Copy, save, print, etc. Can understand short, simple messages on cards or written by a friend such as See you in the evening; Can understand short, simple meeting and leaving; Can use basic expressions when meeting and leaving; Can make simple purchases while using pointing and other gestures; Can make simple purchases quantities, prices and time expressions; Can ask for and give various everyday objects; Can gescribe his place of residence; He can say when he does not understand something; Can sk the interlocutor to repeat what he said; Can fill out a form with personal data; Can write a greeting or card eg. For a birthday; Can write a short message to a friend; Can write sentences and simple phrases for himself eg. What's his name?
