SOCVOC

In 2021, there were over half a million prisoners across the EU, including both convicted individuals serving prison sentences and those in pre-trial detention. Prison living conditions are regulated by numerous laws and guidelines, ranging from constitutional provisions to national criminal and penitentiary laws, as well as international legal standards. A crucial aspect of analyzing prison conditions is whether individual sentence plans are offered and, if so, whether they are properly designed and effectively implemented to ensure that their intended outcomes truly help inmates reintegrate into society and lead responsible, crime-free lives after release.

Rehabilitation efforts should include work, education, and reintegration programs preparing inmates for life after prison. With this in mind, the SOCVOC partnership has prioritized strengthening prisoners' social skills through vocational training. At the same time, it is essential to train educators working with adult learners in correctional facilities, equipping them with the necessary skills and competencies to succeed in this unique environment.

The core of the project is the development of an easy-to-use guide and open educational resources (OER) containing best practices and methodologies for teaching social skills to low-skilled learners, as well as training teachers on how to utilize these tools effectively.

The project aims to promote the use of an online educational platform with tailored exercises and user-friendly instruments designed for the target group. The outcomes and activities of this project can also be used by prison educators in their own educational programs within the correctional facilities of the project partners.

By using the exercises and tools available on the platform and in the guide, learners will have the opportunity to improve both their vocational and social skills, which are crucial for securing employment after release. The true innovation of this project lies in the fact that the specially developed materials will be easily accessible as open educational resources for both the target group and their educators.


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
